For dandruff sufferers, fighting the flakes may often feel like a losing battle. A chronic scalp condition that affects approximately half of the world's population in varying

degrees, dandruff is dependent on a combination of three factors: scalp oils or sebum, the *Malassezia globosa* fungus and the individual's skin's response to the presence of the fungus.

The *Malassezia* fungus lives on everybody's scalps and feeds off the sebum, excreting by-products which can irritate the scalp skin and result in an onset of dandruff.





Participants will vie for the coveted St. John's Alumni (Asia) Trophy in a team competition between golfers from different countries. In addition there will also be a competition for the best golfer who will carry away the RCD Championship Trophy donated by the Dermatological Society of Malaysia.

An optional game can be arranged at the adjacent Montgomerie Links Vietnam, the next day for those not fully satisfied with their earlier outing.

Montgomerie Links Golf Course



Montgomerie Links is located midway between Hoi An (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) and Danang, Vietnam's vibrant third largest city. It is just 15 minutes drive from Danang International Airport.

The 2012 Forbes Travel Guide rated Montgomerie Links as one of Asia's ten most elite courses. It has been designed to capitalize on its close proximity to the warm, tranquil East Sea and famed Marble Mountains, which are clearly visible from various points on the 18-hole course.

The over-arching design philosophy behind all of Colin Montgomerie's designs is to work closely with natural characteristics of each site. Montgomerie Links Vietnam has many truly outstanding natural features. The sandy soil, wind-blown dunes, and indigenous vegetation combine to create the framework for a very strong links-style golf course that caters to players of all abilities and is a sheer delight to play.

Although the course doesn't officially have a signature hole, the stunning par-5 12th is truly memorable. Playing slightly uphill to a bunker-riddled fairway, the hole is framed by the clubhouse in the background and has been described as the best par-5 in Vietnam.

Danang Golf Club



Danang Golf Club is just 20 minutes drive from Danang International Airport.

The Danang Golf Club opened in 2010 and immediately leapt to fame being recognized as one of the 15 best new courses in the world by USA GOLF magazine. The following year Danang Golf Club was voted the 2011 best new golf course in Asia by the readers of Asian Golf Monthly.

The course is built on the sandy loam soil of China Beach, a place where history is revered as much as golf. The Vietnam golf club is located directly on the

beach that the American's used for their first landing and adjacent to the American's main supply depot and airfield used during the Vietnam War of the 1960's. Here, along Vietnam's golf coast and amid a seaside landscape almost identical to what the world's first courses were carved from, an experience was crafted as much by Mother Nature as it was by the legendary Great White Shark, Greg Norman. In other words, it's links-style golf in the truest sense of the term.

Reminiscent of both Scottish links golf and Australia sand-belt courses, Australia's Great White Shark Norman has created something special in Vietnam that will make you want to play this course again and again.


